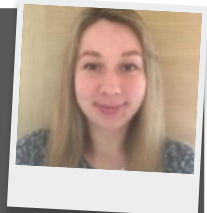

What our students say about us

Student experience and outcomes

Results from the 2023 National Student Survey (NSS), which is carried out by the Office for Students (OfS), showed high levels of satisfaction amongst students on our university-level courses.

The NSS asked final year undergraduate students for honest feedback about what it has been like to study on their Higher Education course, with experimental statistics providing summary scores for key themes.

Teaching

87% of our students were positive about the teaching on their course.

- 92% of students said staff were good at explaining things,
- 87% said staff often made the subject engaging,
- 85% said the course was intellectually stimulating, and
- 86% said they were challenged to achieve their best work.

Academic support

83% of our students were positive about the academic support on their course.

- 79% of students said that it was easy to contact teaching staff when they needed to, and
- 88% said they had received good support from teaching staff.

Learning opportunities

84% of our students were positive about the learning opportunities on their course.

- 81% of students said they explored ideas and concepts in depth on their course,
- 88% said the course introduced subjects and skills in a way that built on what they had already learned,
- 86% said there were opportunities to bring together information and ideas from different topics,
- 76% said their course had the right balance of directed and independent study, and
- 90% said their course had developed knowledge and skills needed for their future career.

Student Voice

83% of our students were positive about the academic support on their course.

- 82% of students said they get the right opportunities to give feedback on their course,
- 75% said students' opinions about the course are valued by staff,
- 61% said it is clear that students' feedback on the course is acted on, and
- 62% said that the Students' Union represents students' academic interests.



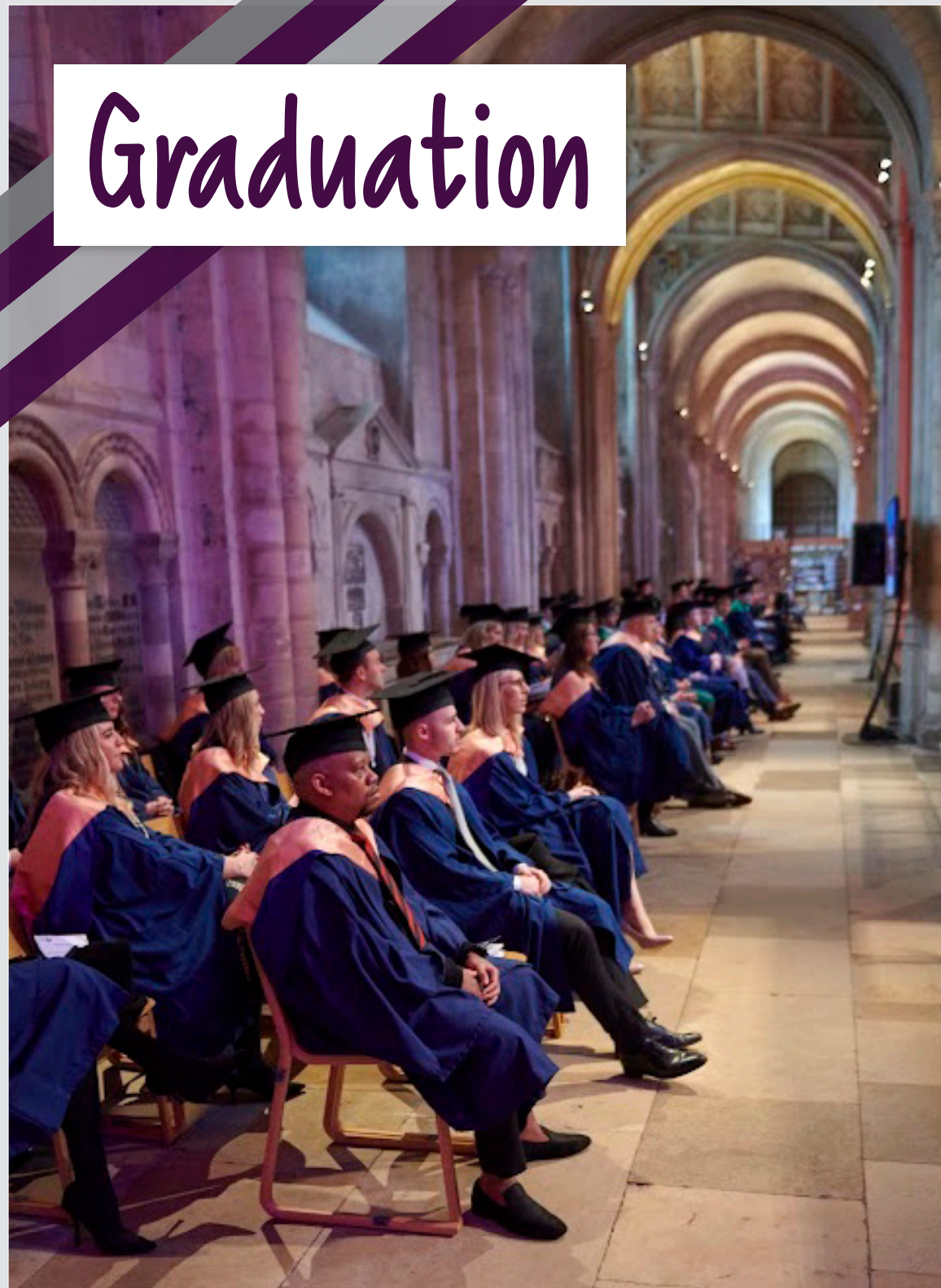
The Teaching Excellence Framework (TEF) is a national scheme run by the Office for Students (OfS) that aims to encourage higher education providers to improve and deliver excellence in the areas that students care about most: teaching, learning and achieving positive outcomes from their studies.

The TEF does this by assessing and rating universities and colleges for excellence above a set of minimum requirements for quality and standards. The ratings reflect the extent to which a provider delivers an excellent experience and outcomes for its students and across the range of its university-level courses and subjects.

City College Norwich and Easton College were awarded a Silver rating overall in 2023, achieving a Silver rating for both student experience and student outcomes. This means that the student experience and outcomes at our college are typically very high quality, and there may be some outstanding features.

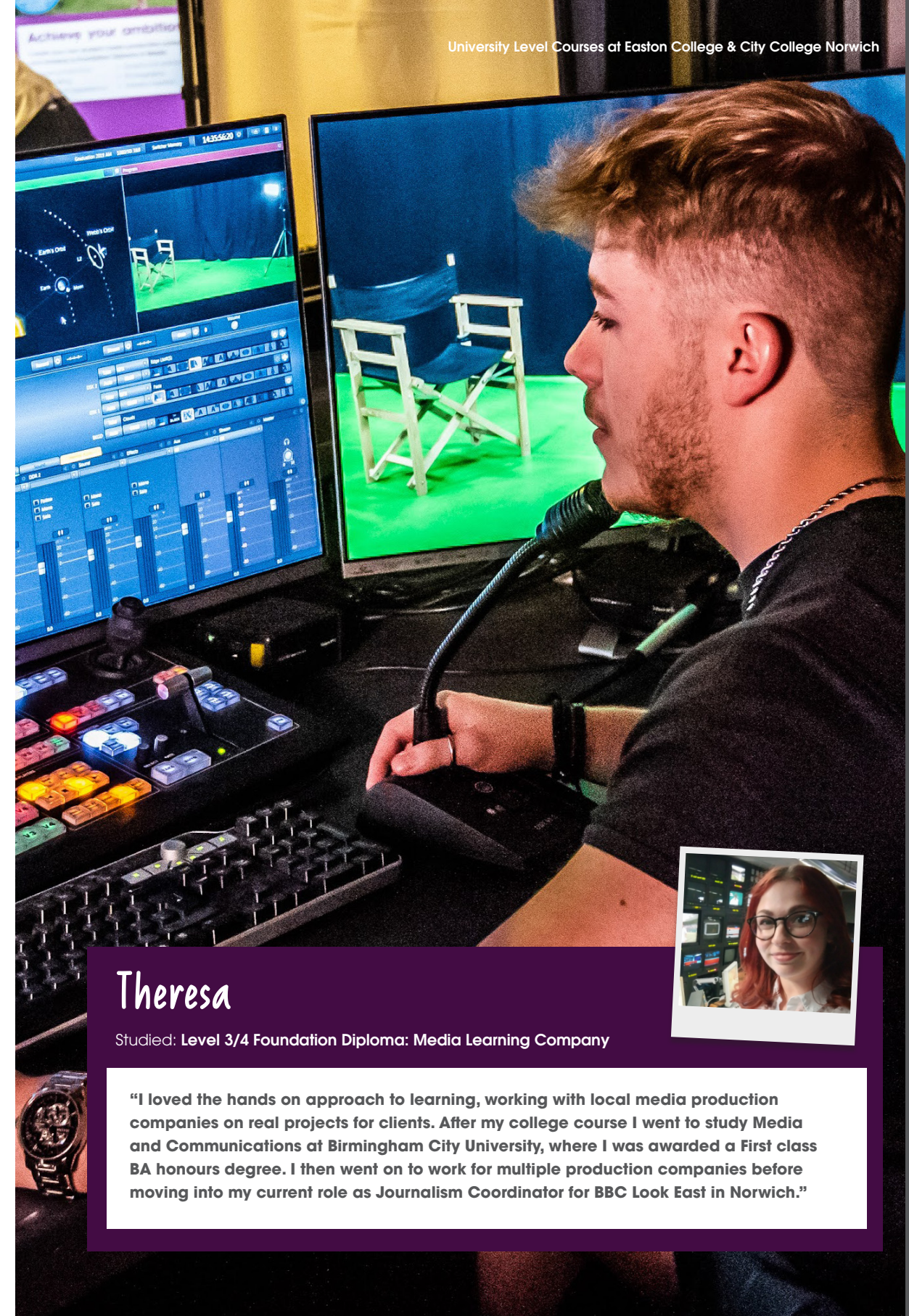

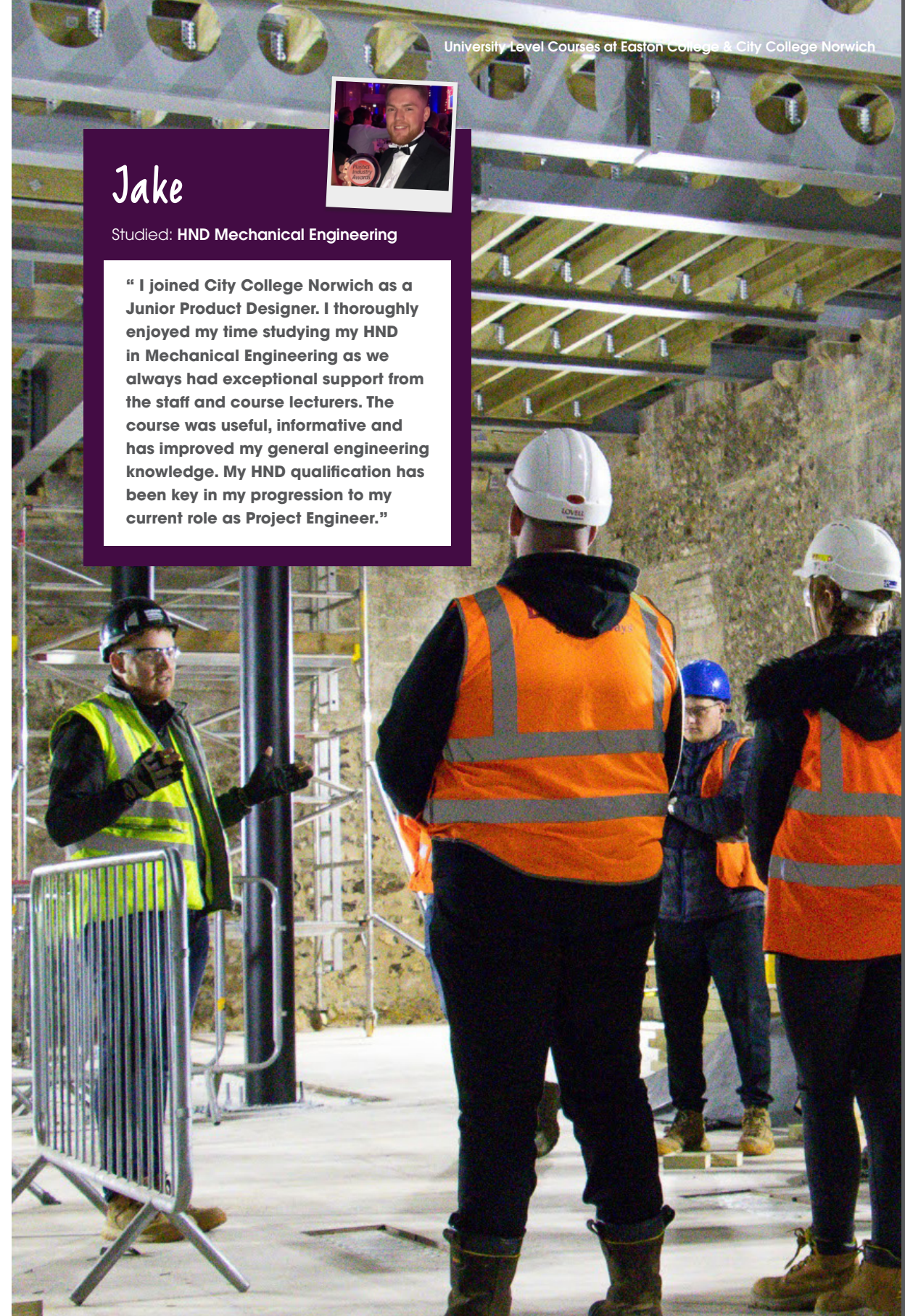

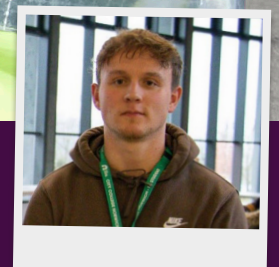

A degree in Psychology with Sociology will provide you with a thorough grounding in the key strands, theories and debates within Psychology and Sociology. The Psychology modules provide a broad and stimulating foundation in cognitive and biological psychology, child development and social psychology. You will study areas including clinical psychology, mental health and wellbeing, language and psychology and crime. Organically complementing the Psychology modules on the inner workings of the human mind, the companion Sociology modules explore the wider social world and the social forces within, in order to explore how societies and communities function and change - and how they may or may not shape us.

The degree will equip you with the critical thinking skills needed to evaluate the strengths and weakness of applying psychological and sociological concepts and theories in a range of contexts. You will develop their research skills to give you the opportunity to carry out your own research project as part of your dissertation. Overall, this course will develop your understanding of human emotion, behaviour and the influence of the ever-developing social world around us.

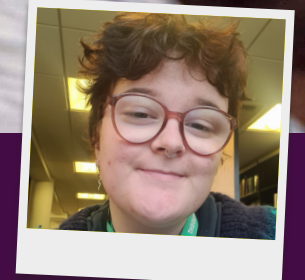

Sport

Our Sport, Health & Exercise Science degree provides a solid grounding in academic and theoretical knowledge alongside the chance to develop a variety of practical skills. The first year covers core units in anatomy and human movement, community coaching and development, health and fitness, sport and exercise physiology, and sports therapy. You can then select from pathways in Sport, Health and Exercise Science; Health, Fitness, Strength and Conditioning; and Coaching and Development.

Graduates go on to a range of job roles within the sport and leisure industry, including in research and development, activity leadership, sports coaching, strength and conditioning coaching, personal training, and health promotion. 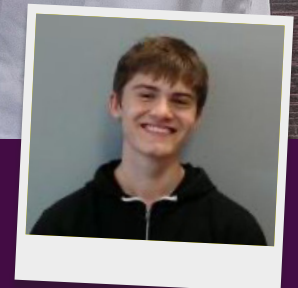

Wildlife Conservation, Zoological & Animal Sciences

In an era of climate change and human population pressure, there has never been a more important time to enter the diverse range of careers connected with animal science, wildlife conservation, and zoology. With specialist facilities including our Animal Care Centre, Nature reserve, and working farm with a range of diverse habitats, Easton College is the perfect place to study these applied sciences.

These courses develop practical and theoretical knowledge of the fundamental concepts surrounding domestic and captive species. Modules will include applied animal husbandry, animal nutrition, and animal behaviour and welfare science. Our Wildlife and Conservation degree offers practical involvement with everything from managing our own nature reserve and generating surveys, to producing management plans for external sites. Our Zoology degree will give you the opportunity to develop laboratory techniques required in industry, species classification, and understanding the morphological traits that support diverse species in variable habitats.

Your studies will be supported by a range of guest speakers, trips and visits that get throughout the academic year.

You will also gain hands-on experience with software such as QGIS (Quantum Geographic Information Systems), which is used across a range of sectors for visualising and analysing spatial data. There will also be opportunities to use specialist equipment such as microbiology photographic microscopes, entomological photographic microscopes, and PCR (Polymerase Chain Reaction) and gel electrophoresis to facilitate DNA barcoding. In addition to this you will also have access to specialist survey equipment including camera traps, bat detectors and image intensifiers.

Understanding University Level Study



Higher Education providers do like to throw around quite a lot of jargon, so in true academic style here is a quick definition of the key terms we use to describe our courses.

You will be familiar with the qualifications you may have completed at school or college such as GCSE's (which are at Level 2) and A levels/ BTECs (which are Level 3 courses), so in simple terms university-level courses / Higher Education means anything which leads to a qualification at Level 4 or above.

Bachelors Degrees

Bachelor degrees (given the title of either Bachelor of Art (BA) or Bachelor of Science (BSc), typically with honours (Hons)) cover courses with outcomes at Level 6. These are normally three-year programmes with the depth of study increasing through the three years i.e. you will start with level 4 modules in year one, moving through level 5 and onto Level 6 modules by the final year.

Foundation Degrees

Foundation Degree (given the title of either Foundation degree of Arts (FdA) or Foundation degree of Science (FdSc)) are Level 5 qualifications. This level of study is equivalent to the first two years of an undergraduate bachelor degree.

Higher National Qualifications

Higher National Qualifications from Pearson are taught as either a Higher National Diploma (HND) at Level 5, or a Higher National Certificate (HNC)

at Level 4. Our Pearson Higher National Certificates and Diplomas in Construction Management have been recognised as Higher Technical Qualifications (HTQs) which is a new quality mark for some Level 4 and Level 5 qualifications that have been approved against specific occupational standards decided by employers. We expect that more of our Level 4 and 5 course will become HTQs in the future.

Higher & Degree Apprenticeships

We also offer a range of Higher and Degree Apprenticeships. These differ from the study types previously listed in that they are through your employer but they follow the same Level 4, Level 5 and Level 6 qualification system. We offer higher apprenticeships at Level 4 and Level 5, and degree apprenticeships at Level 6.

Teacher Training

Through the Norfolk Teacher Training Centre (NTTC) we offer some courses at post-graduate level courses (Level 7), which is equivalent to a Master's degree in terms of the level of study.

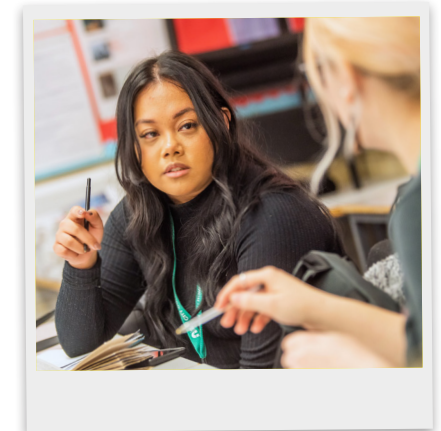

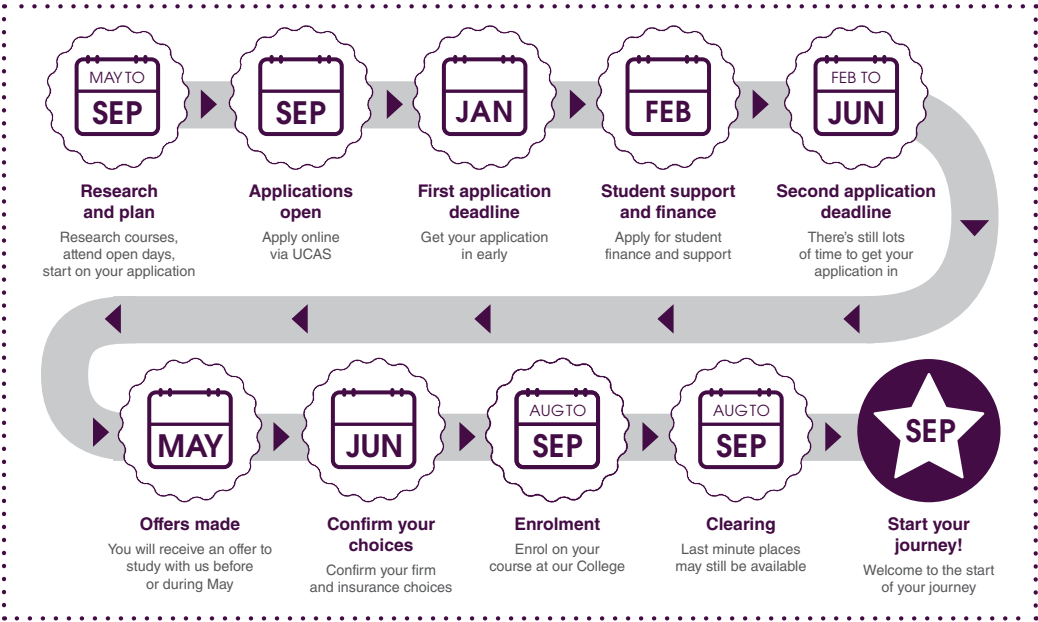

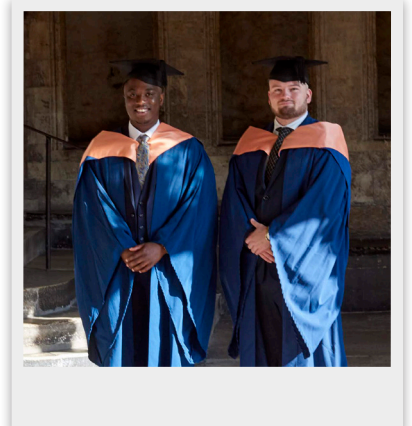

Had a break from education? Don't worry

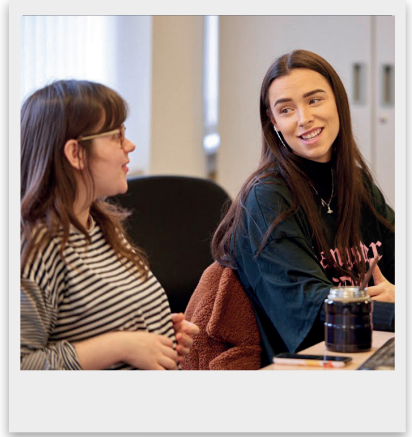
Many of our mature students join us after a break from education; some have few, if any, formal qualifications, but this is not necessarily a barrier. In these circumstances we take the time to assess whether you have sufficient relevant experience that we could consider to be equivalent to the qualifications needed.



Recognition of Prior Learning, or Recognition of Prior Experiential Learning (RPL/RPEL)

If you have gained qualifications at an appropriate level that are relevant to the programme, or have relevant experience gained in a work-based or vocational setting, you may be given credit, and possibly exemption, from certain elements of the programme.

Claims for RPL/RPEL must be made and resolved before joining a programme, so be sure to ask at your interview if you think this could apply to you.

Student finance



University level study is a great investment in your future career and earnings potential.

The university level courses we offer may be self-funded, paid for through a tuition fee loan from Student Finance England, or funded by your employer.

Course costs

For 2024-25 entry, the standard cost of our full-time degree courses (including Foundation Degrees) for home students is £8,000 per year. For higher fee courses, the cost is £9,000 per year.

HNCs and HNDs for home students are charged at £765 per 15 credit unit (plus a first-year registration fee of £206 for HNC and £262 for HND, and a £21 annual registration fee in each subsequent year).

You can find full fee information for all our courses – including the fees applicable for international students - contained within the detailed course information listings on our website.

Other forms of financial help for students

If you have dependent children, you may also be eligible for other help such as a Parents Learning Allowance or a Childcare Grant. If you have a disability, you may be eligible for a Disabled Students Allowance.

Student loans

You may be eligible for a tuition fee loan from Student Finance England to cover the cost of tuition fees. There may also be maintenance loans available depending on your circumstances.

Student loans do not have to be paid back until after you complete your course and you are earning at least £27,295.

UEA Library

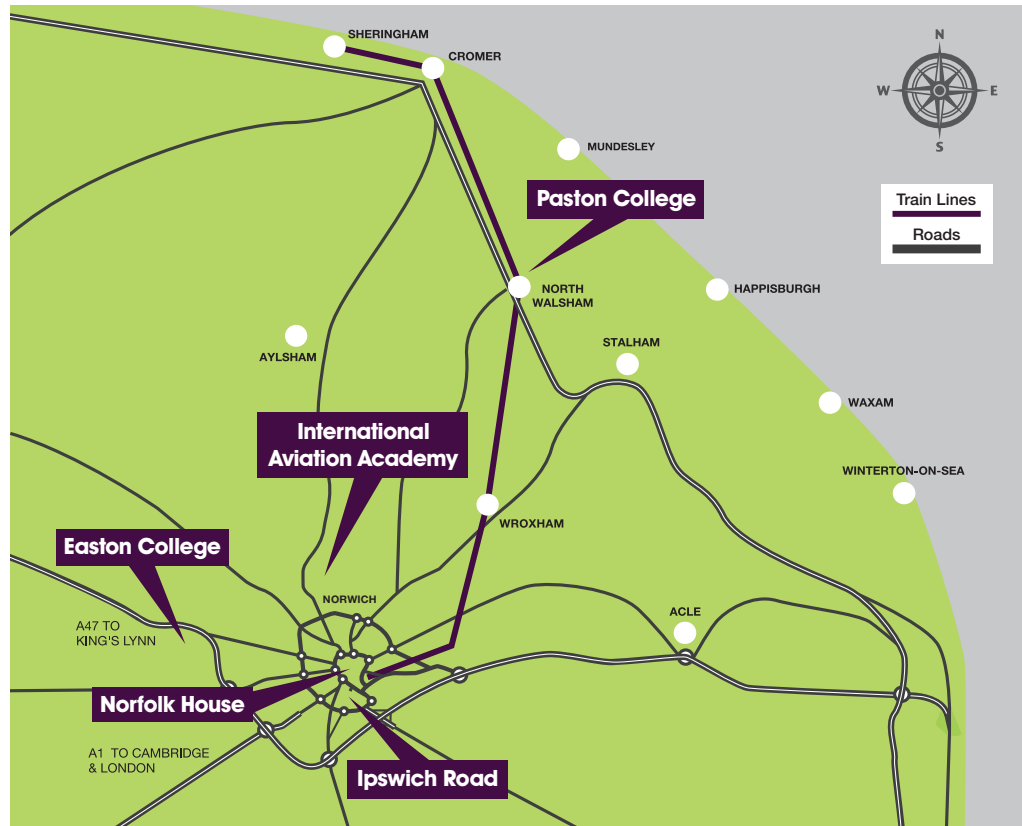
One of the benefits of being a Partner College of UEA is that all our students are provided with a UEA campus card, giving access to the UEA Library and its extensive collections.

Norfolk House

Norfolk House can be found in the heart of the city centre on Exchange Street. There is no car parking available, but lots of car parks are located nearby. The nearest bus stops are on Castle Meadow, Tombland, and Prince of Wales Road.

Easton College

Easton College is located 6.5 miles from Norwich city centre, off the A47. Car parking is available on campus and the nearby village of Easton is well-served by direct bus routes from the city centre.

Ipswich Road

The Ipswich Road campus is located on Ipswich Road, approximately 1/2 mile from the city centre. Car parking is available on campus and bus stops are located outside the college.

International Aviation Academy Norwich

The Academy is located 4 miles outside Norwich, next to Norwich Airport. Car parking is available and the nearest bus stop is 10 minutes walk away.

Services run Monday to Saturday, with arrivals in the city before 7am and last buses back at approximately 7pm (depending on the site).
